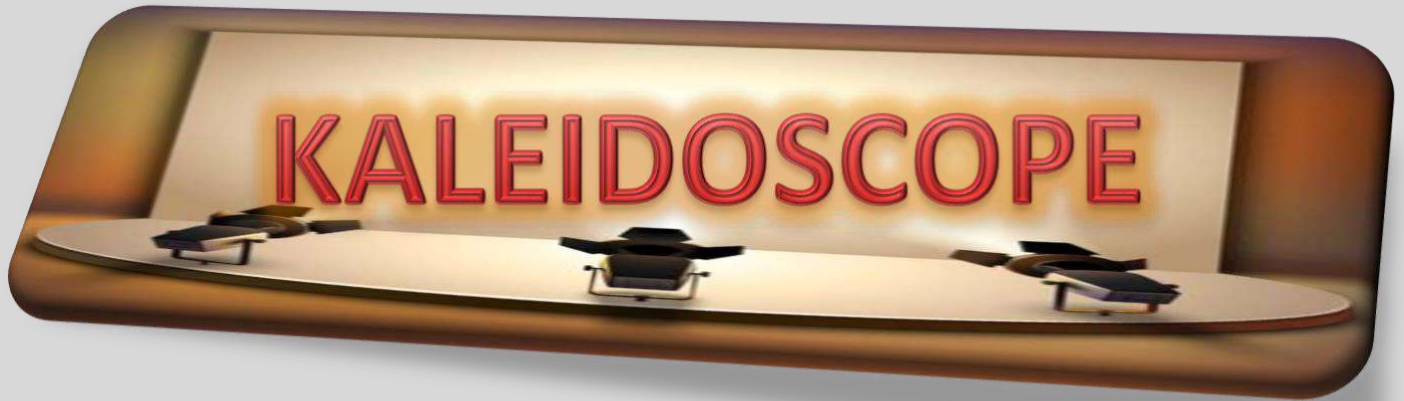

## Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Mahaparinirvan Din 6/12/2022

The Mahaparinirvan Diwas, or death anniversary, of the father of the Indian Constitution, Dr. BR Ambedkar is celebrated on December 6. He was an Indian jurist, economist, social reformer, and political figure who served as the chairman of the committee that drafted the Constitution of India from the discussions in the Constituent Assembly. He also held the position of Law and Justice Minister in Jawaharlal Nehru's first cabinet and, after renunciation of Hinduism, served as an inspiration for the Dalit Buddhist movement. The state of Parinirvana is one of Buddhism's fundamental concepts. It denotes a person who has attained nirvana or freedom both during their life and after they pass away. Achieving nirvana after death or the liberation of the soul from the body after death is referred to as Parinirvan in Sanskrit. The word "Parinibbana," which means the accomplishment of nirvana, is used in Pali. Babasaheb Ambedkar's death anniversary is known as Mahaparinirvana Diwas because of his stature as a revered Buddhist leader. GCER gave tribute Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar by offering garland to his photo and by praying for his soul.

डॉ. बाबासाहेब आंबेडकर हे महान शिक्षणतज्ज्ञ होते, एवढेच नव्हे तर शिक्षणाला मूलभूत अधिकाराचा दर्जा प्राप्त करवून दिला. शिक्षणविषयक तरतुदींना घटनात्मक संरक्षण प्राप्त करून दिले. मात्र भारतीय शिक्षणविषयक स्वातंत्र्य व अधिकारांचे खरे व खंबीर व भक्कम संरक्षणसुद्धा ठरतात. अशा या महामानवाला, युगपुरुषांना त्यांच्या स्मृतिदिनाप्रीत्यर्थ त्रिवार अभिवादन!

शिका ! संघटित व्हा !! संघर्ष करा !!! हा उद्धाराराचा राजमार्गच बाबासाहेबांनी संपूर्ण भारतीयांना दिला. महात्मा ज्योतीबा फुले यांच्या सामाजिक, शैक्षणिक, विषमतानिर्मूलनाच्या कार्याचा वारसा डॉ. बाबासाहेब आंबेडकरांनी पुढे चालविला आणि त्यांना गुरुस्थानी मानून सामाजिक क्रांतीचे कार्य अधिक सक्षम बनविले. शोषितवर्गाचे शिक्षण झाले पाहिजे, हा त्यांचा आग्रह होता. देशातील विषमतेला नष्ट करणारा एकमेव उपाय म्हणजे शिक्षण होय, डॉक्टर बाबासाहेब आंबेडकरांचे शैक्षणिक कारकीर्द सुद्धा अतिशय भव्य व प्रेरक आहे. आज आपण डॉ बाबासाहेब आंबेडकर यांचे शैक्षणिक कार्य आणि योगदान जाणून घेऊया .

बाबासाहेब आंबेडकर हे उच्चविद्याविभूषित शिक्षणतज्ज्ञ होते. “शिक्षण हे वाघिणीचे दूध आहे, आणि जो ते प्राशन करेल तो वाघासारखा गुरगुरल्याशिवाय राहणार नाही” असे त्यांनी लिहिलेले लंडनमधून ‘बॅरिस्टर’ ही पदवी संपादन केल्यानंतर त्यांनी संपूर्ण आयुष्यभर भारतीय समाज व्यवस्थेने शोषण केलेल्या शोषित समाजासाठी कार्य केले आणि संविधानात्मक तरतूद करून त्यांच्या अधिकारांना बळकटी दिली. ३१ जानेवारी, १९२० पासून ‘मूकनायक’ हे पाक्षिक सुरू केले. २० जुलै, १९२४ला ‘बहिष्कृत हितकारिणी सभास्थापन केली तसेच ‘बहिष्कृत भारत’ पाक्षिक सुरू केले. आणखी ‘प्रबुद्ध भारत’ हे एक नवीन पाक्षिक सुरू केले. भारतीयांच्या उद्दारासाठी सामाजिक आणि शैक्षणिक क्षेत्रातील बाबासाहेबांचे कार्य फार श्रेष्ठ असून वाचनालये, समाजकेंद्रे, अभ्यासमंडळे, वसतिगृहांच्या सोयी करून शोषितांना शिक्षणाची प्रेरणा दिली. सभा, मेळाव्यांमधून समाजजागृतीचे कार्य त्यांनी केले.

दीनदलित आणि गोरगरीब बहुजन समाजाच्या शैक्षणिक स्थितीला उंचावण्यासाठी डॉक्टर बाबासाहेब आंबेडकर यांनी बहिष्कृत हितकारिणी सभा स्थापन केली. या संस्थेच्या मदतीने दीनदलितांच्या शैक्षणिक स्थितीमध्ये सुधारणा व्हावी आणि सामाजिक व आर्थिक दृष्ट्या समाजाची परिस्थिती सुधारावी हा उद्देश मनात ठेवून 4 जानेवारी 1925 या दिवशी सोलापूर याठिकाणी बाबासाहेबांनी एक वसतिगृह स्थापन केले. गरीब आणि दलित विद्यार्थ्यांना निवास, भोजन, कपडे त्याचप्रमाणे शैक्षणिक साहित्यही या संस्थेच्या मदतीने पुरवली. या ठिकाणी मोफत वाचनालय सुद्धा सुरू केले.

समाजाच्या मुख्य प्रवाहापासून दूर लोटल्या गेलेल्या बहुजन वर्गातील गोरगरीब मुलांच्या माध्यमिक शिक्षणाची सोय व्हावी म्हणून डॉक्टर बाबासाहेब आंबेडकर यांनी 14 जून 1928 रोजी दलित शिक्षण संस्थेची स्थापना केली. त्यावेळच्या मुंबई सरकारकडे त्यांनी या संस्थेला मदत देण्यासाठी आवाहन केले. मुंबई सरकारने या संस्थेला 5 वस्तीगृहे मंजूर केली. मुंबईच्या गव्हर्नरने दरमहा नऊ हजार रुपये अनुदान या वसतिगृहांसाठी दिले. अर्थात ते कमी पडू लागल्यानंतर बाबासाहेबांनी पारशी आणि मुस्लिम समाजातील धर्मादाय संस्थांकडून देणग्या मिळवल्या व हे कार्य नेटाने पुढे नेले.

बाबासाहेबांनी समाजाच्या शिक्षणासाठी आणि वैचारिक जागृतीसाठी पाच वृत्तपत्रे सुरू केली होती. या वृत्तपत्रांच्या माध्यमातून समाजाचे शिक्षण आणि समाजाच्या उद्धारासाठी आवश्यक असलेले नेतृत्व देत असताना आपले विचार त्यांनी प्रकट केले आहेत. बाबासाहेब करीत असलेले कार्य या वर्तमानपत्रांमधून प्रसिद्ध होत असे. त्याचप्रमाणे त्या काळातील विविध विषयांवर असणारी त्यांचे मौलिक विचारसुद्धा त्यामधून प्रकाशित होत असत.

डॉ. बाबासाहेब आंबेडकर यांचा शैक्षणिक दृष्टिकोन अतिशय प्रगल्भ होता. राज्यघटना लिहीत असताना शिक्षण विषयक धोरण आणि आणि कायदे यांचा राज्यघटनेत आवर्जून बाबासाहेबांनी उल्लेख केला आहे. शिक्षणप्रेमी डॉ. बाबासाहेब आंबेडकरांनी लोक शिक्षण या नात्याने अनेक शैक्षणिक कार्य केले ते सांगतात, "विद्यार्थ्यांनी हे लक्षात ठेवा, शिक्षणा अभावी माणूस सर्वस्व गमावतो. सर्व मानव जन्मजात समान असून प्रत्येकाला शिक्षणाचा अधिकार आहे. त्यासाठी सर्वांनी शिकले पाहिजे." म्हणून म्हटले जाते,

नींद अपनी खोकर जगाया हमको,  
आंसू अपने गिराकर हंसाय हमको..  
कभी भूलना मत उस महान इंसान को,  
जमाना कहता है बाबा साहेब आंबेडकर जिनको।।

## Human Rights in India

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Human Rights Day is celebrated across the world on December 10. On this day, the United Nations General Assembly adopted the Universal Declaration of Human Rights in 1948. This historic document can be considered as the first major international instrument affirming individual rights. Though this document is not legally binding, its contents have permeated hundreds of international conventions, agreements as well as domestic laws of various countries.

### What are human rights?

In order to live with dignity certain basic rights and freedoms are necessary, which all Human beings are entitled to; these basic rights are called Human Rights

Human rights demand recognition and respect for the inherent dignity to ensure that everyone is protected against abuses which undermine their dignity, and give the opportunities they need to realize their full potential, free from discrimination.

### Human rights include civil and political rights, such as:

- The right to freedom of expression
- The right to freedom of religion or conscience
- The right to property
- The right to freedom of assembly
- The right to privacy
- The right to vote.

Fundamental rights for Indians have also been aimed at overturning the inequalities of pre-independence social practices. Specifically, they have also been used to abolish untouchability and hence prohibit discrimination on the grounds of religion, race, caste, sex, or place of birth. They also forbid trafficking of human beings and forced labour. They also protect cultural and educational rights of ethnic and religious minorities by allowing them to preserve their languages and also establish and administer their own education institutions. When the Constitution of India came into force it basically gave seven fundamental rights to its citizens. However, Right to Property was removed as a Fundamental Right through 44th Constitutional Amendment in 1978. In 2009, Right to Education Act was added. Every child between the age of 6 to 14 years is entitled to free education.

December 22 was designated as National Mathematics Day (NMD) by Government of India in 2012.

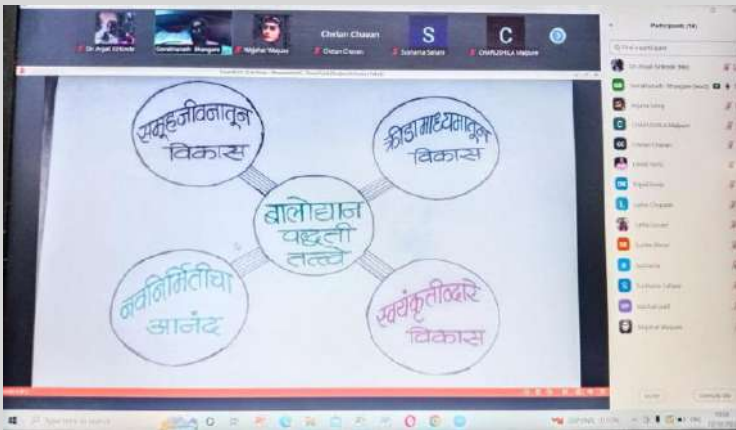
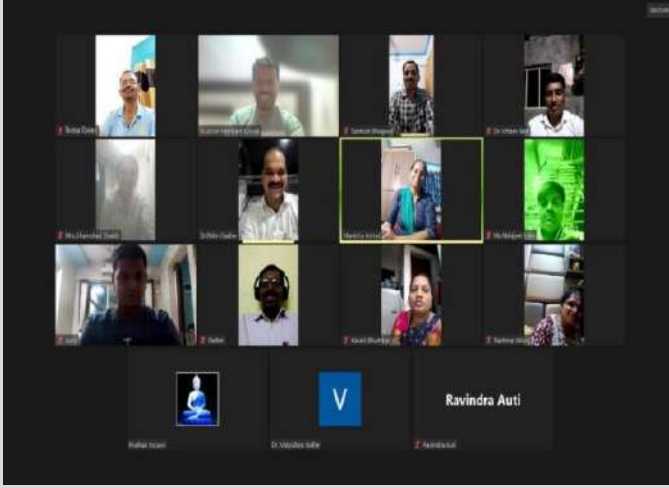
The celebrations aim at spreading awareness about the importance of mathematics and the contributions made by Srinivasa Ramanujan, in the field of mathematics. December 22nd is the National Mathematics Day every year in India, but why do we celebrate Mathematics Day? It is celebrated to pay tribute and commemorate the birthday of the honorary mathematician, Srinivasa Ramanujan. This day was declared by the former Prime Minister Dr. Manmohan Singh at the Madras University in 2012. His announcement came during one of his visits to this university on Srinivasa Ramanujan's 125th birth anniversary. This auspicious day marks the importance of Mathematics in everyone's life and inspires people to grow their self-learning skills and think more rationally.

To celebrate Ramanujan National Mathematics Day, the National Academy of Sciences, India (NASI), the oldest scientific academy in India, conducts a workshop every year on various applications of mathematics and Ramanujan. Well-known lecturers and specialists in Mathematics from all over the nation attend this workshop. Srinivasa Ramanujan Aiyangar was born to a Tamil Brahmin family on December 22, 1887, in the district of Erode in Tamil Nadu. He had significantly less interest in other non-mathematical subjects, which was the cause for his failure in college exams held in the year 1903. In 1912, while Ramanujan was working in the Madras Port Trust as a clerk, he was discovered by one of his colleagues, who also happened to be a mathematician. He introduced Ramanujan to Professor GH Hardy of Trinity College, Cambridge University. Srinivas Ramanujan, a spontaneous mathematical brilliant mind, reshaped Mathematics in the twentieth century through his enormous contributions to various Mathematics domains. His discoveries vastly impacted several areas of mathematics, such as infinite series, mathematical analysis, number theory, continued fractions and even game theory.

## National Mathematics Day 22/12/2022



National Mathematics Day is celebrated every year on December 22 to mark the birth anniversary of legendary mathematician, Srinivasa Ramanujan. Ramanujan was a self-taught mathematician and one of the greatest Indian mathematicians of all time. Ramanujan worked on theorems that seemed impossible to solve for the most of his brief but meaningful life. His work on Riemann series, continued fractions, hypergeometric series, elliptic integrals, and functional equations belonging to the zeta function are well recognised.

On this occasion students prepared Learning Resources. All Learning Resources were displayed on the tables. Best Resources were appreciated by announcing prizes to the students.



## **Consumer Protection Act**

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Consumer protection is the practice of safeguarding buyers of goods and services against unfair practices in the market. It refers to the steps adopted for the protection of consumers from corrupt and unscrupulous malpractices by the sellers, manufacturers, service providers, etc. and to provide remedies in case their rights as a consumer have been violated. In India, the protection of the rights of the consumers is administered by the Consumer Protection Act, 2019. The Consumer Protection Act, 2019 was introduced to replace the Consumer Protection Act, 1986. The new Act contains various provisions which incorporate the challenges faced by modern and technology-dependent consumers. The Act also contains various provisions for the protection and promoting the rights of the consumers.

### **NEED FOR THE CONSUMER PROTECTION ACT, 2019:-**

The Consumer Protection Act, 2019 was enacted by the Indian legislature to deal with matters relating to violation of consumer's rights, unfair trade practices, misleading advertisements, and all those circumstances which are prejudicial to the consumer's rights. The intention of the Parliament behind enacting the Act was to include provisions for e-consumers due to the development of technology, buying and selling of goods and services online have considerably increased during the last few years. The Act seeks to provide better protection of the rights and interests of the consumers by establishing Consumer Protection Councils to settle disputes in case any dispute arises and to provide adequate compensation to the consumers in case their rights have been infringed. It further provides speedy and effective disposal of consumer complaints through alternate dispute resolution mechanisms. The Act also promotes consumer education in order to educate the consumer about their rights, responsibilities and also redressing their grievances.

### **OBJECTIVE OF THE CONSUMER PROTECTION ACT, 2019:-**

The main objective of the Act is to protect the interests of the consumers and to establish a stable and strong mechanism for the settlement of consumer disputes. The Act aims to:

- i) Protect against the marketing of products that are hazardous to life and property.
- ii) Inform about the quality, potency, quantity, standard, purity, and price of goods to safeguard the consumers against unfair trade practices.
- iii) Establish Consumer Protection Councils for protecting the rights and interests of the consumers.
- iv) Assure, wherever possible, access to an authority of goods at competitive prices.
- v) Seek redressal against unfair trade practices or unscrupulous exploitation of consumers.
- vi) Protect the consumers by appointing authorities for timely and sufficient administration and settlement of consumers' disputes.
- vii) Lay down the penalties for offences committed under the Act.
- viii) Hear and ensure that consumers' welfare will receive due consideration at appropriate forums in case any problem or dispute arises.
- ix) Provide consumer education, so that the consumers are able to be aware of their rights.
- x) Provide speedy and effective disposal of consumer complaints through alternate dispute resolution mechanisms.

### **WHAT ARE UNFAIR TRADE PRACTICES UNDER CONSUMER PROTECTION ACT, 2019:-**

Section 2(47) of the Consumer Protection Act, 2019 defines the term 'unfair trade practices' which include:

- i) Manufacturing spurious goods or providing defective services.
- ii) Not issuing cash memos or bills for the goods purchased or services rendered.
- iii) Refusing to take back or withdraw the goods or services and not refunding the consideration taken for the purchase of the goods or services.
- iv) Disclosing the personal information of the consumer.

### **ESSENTIAL PROVISIONS OF CONSUMER PROTECTION ACT, 2019:-**

The essential provisions (Consumer Protection Councils) of the Consumer Protection Act, 2019 are:

- i) Central Consumer Protection Council
- ii) State Consumer Protection Councils
- iii) District Consumer Protection Council

## National Consumers Day 24/12/2022

The National Consumer Day or Bharatiya Grahak Diwas is celebrated every year on December 24 with an aim to spread awareness about consumer rights and the power of a consumer. In India, to keep the integrity of consumers and protect them from malpractices, a set of rights is conferred to every citizen under the Consumer Protection Act.
