

Guru Nanak Dev's 5 teachings that will change the way you look at life

One of the most celebrated and important Sikh gurus and the founder of Sikhism, Guru Nanak Dev is highly revered by the Sikh community. This is one of the most sacred festivals in Sikhism, or Sikhi. The festivities in the Sikh religion revolve around the anniversaries of the 10 Sikh Gurus. The most famous teachings attributed to Guru Nanak are that there is only one God, and that all human beings can have direct access to God with no need of rituals or priests. His most radical social teachings denounced the caste system and taught that everyone is equal, regardless of caste or gender.

Here are 5 of his many teachings that will change your perspective towards life:

1. Vaand Chhako: Sharing whatever God has given you with others and helping those who are in need is what Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji preached all his life. This is one of the principles of Sikhism. He said,

"With the grace of the Lord, whatever you have received, Share it with the needy and then consume."

- 2. Kirat Karo: Means, make a living honestly. One should not exploit others to enjoy self-happiness. Earning without fraud and working diligently is what he preached
- 3. Naam Japo: Chant the name of 'True God'. Sri Guru Nanak Dev emphasized meditating on God's name to gain control over five evils- **kama, krodh, lobh, moh, ahankar** means lust, anger, greed, attachment and ego.
- 4. Sarbat daa bhalaa: Ask Lord for everyone's happiness. Sri Guru Nanak dev emphasized the concept of universal brotherhood. He said that despite religion, caste, and gender, everyone should seek well for others and only then one can have that goodness back in return. At the end of daily Ardaas prayer, it is said, "Nanak Naam Chardi Kala Tere Bhane Sarbat da bhala", which means "Nanak with your name and blessings, may everyone in the world peace.
- 5. Speak the truth without any fear: Sri Guru Nanak Dev said to always speak the truth without any fear. He said, getting victory by suppressing falsehood is temporary and standing firmly by truth is permanent. Sticking to the truth is also one ofthe 'hukums' (orders) of the Guru.Many of Sri Guru Nanak's shabads (hymns), which form a part of the Sri Guru Granth Sahib,reflect clearly how the sight of God and his love itself is supreme.



PANDIT JAWAHARLAL NEHRU THOUGHT ON EDUCATION

Jawahar Lal Nehru once said," The object of education was to produce a desire to serve the community as a whole and to apply the knowledge gained not only for personal but for public welfare".

Education, according to Nehru had economic as well as social objectives. It should culturally improve a man and also enable him to generate wealth in society. He said "Unless you produce the amount you consume you are a burden to society". Nehru believed India's massive unemployment crisis could be solved with basic education. This gave people the capacity "to coordinate manual labour with mental and intellectual ability".

Technology and industry are the primary requirements to battle poverty and unemployment. As such, Nehru, who introduced the concept of five-year plans for the overall development of India, laid great importance upon scientific education. This was done so that the nation could produce a workforce, which was skilled enough to implement the plans. He also established national science laboratories in core areas of science all over India and started the IITs, which together helped take India to great heights in technical development. However, Nehru also warned that "we should accept technology without leaving basic values which are the essence of civilized man.

Nehru's main objective via education was to do away with the narrow religious and communalistic views and promote a scientific and humanitarian mindset. Being Western-educated himself, he believed English education helped broaden India's horizons and created a "revolt against some customs and aspects of Indian life, and a growing demand for political reform". However, he also believed that regional languages ought to be the primary medium for the success of educational programs.

Nehru is considered the architect of the modern educational system in India as he formulated the educational policy on becoming Independent India's first Prime Minister. Impressed by the scientific progress of the West, he visualized western aims and means for primary, secondary, and university levels of education. This may be called his weakness, but it was also the strength behind his educational policy. Nehru's contribution to the scientific development of the country cannot be ignored as it helped India to become of the top five nations in the world to boast of an all-round development.
